Major cities were once filled with sparrows, but the number of these small garden birds fell quickly in the late 20th century. In Great Britain, for example, sparrow numbers in cities fell by nearly half from 1970 to 2013.

In 1994, a charity group called the British Trust for Ornithology started the BTO Garden BirdWatch project. This project follows how the numbers of local birds change over time in Great Britain. This information comes from volunteers in cities who count birds in their gardens. Then, they send this information to the group over the Internet or by mail.

People with Garden BirdWatch have noticed some interesting things in their data. For example, it showed that sparrows had had fewer babies in the south and east of Great Britain, than in the north and west. They also noticed that around 2009, the number of sparrows across the country seemed to have stopped falling. Thanks to projects like Garden BirdWatch, common people can work together with scientists to identify and take care of local problems.

Garden BirdWatch says we can all help the sparrows. They like wood boxes to live in and thick plants to hide in, so buying these for your garden can help. You can also give them seeds to eat as well, but be sure that the area where they eat is clean.

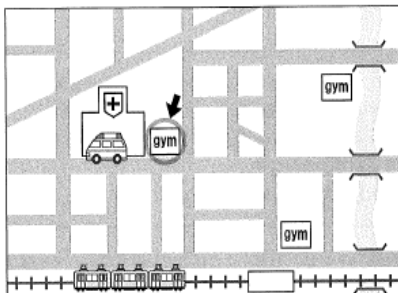
